Registration is open for the 2016 convention in Baltimore!





Joint Commission on Sports Medicine and Science (JCSMS)

NATA President Scott Sailor, EdD, ATC and Executive Director Dave Saddler attended the annual JCSMS meeting in February to share NATA's current priorities and learn about initiatives being undertaken by other associations in the sports medicine and sports science arenas. The purpose of the JCSMS is to serve as a catalyst for cooperative programs between the 37 organizations that comprise the group.

New Year New Look and a NATA Foundation Milestone Celebration!

The NATA Foundation is proud to present an updated logo and a new website to kick off our 25th Anniversary Celebration! The current NATA Foundation was incorporated in 1991 and established with grants from the NATA and Johnson & Johnson. During these past 25 years, the NATA Foundation has awarded more than 260 research grants totaling more than \$4 million dollars and awarded almost \$3 million to 1,490 students through our scholarship program. Additionally almost 5,000 presentations (oral and poster) have been provided through the Free Communications program.



NATA Knowledge Initiatives update

The quiz center closed with its strongest year ever. There were 143,007 free CEUs used. This is by far the largest number ever used. The normal cost to a member per CEU in the center is \$15. At that cost the value of CEUs that were free in 2015 is over \$2,000,000. The increased usage is due in great part to the EBP category of CEUs available in the center.

Degree Transition – What’s Next?

In response to the degree transition, the Professional Development Committee and Executive Committee for Education have begun rolling out on-demand sessions targeted to educators to assist with degree transition plans. Each session provides information that is based on best practices and provides tools to help frame critical thinking. The content is not prescriptive and is accompanied by a disclaimer that states this fact.

In response to a survey conducted by the Professional Education Committee several categories of interest were addressed by educators as to where they would like assistance. The most important thing was determining if they wanted to transition. Based on the feedback, an on-demand session was rolled out in December that introduces the use of a SWOT analysis and input from two programs that have made the transition. The session has been well-received. The next session is now under development and will focus on organizational structure.

NATA Leadership Development

In January, the BOD gave the go-ahead to a proposal for a revamp of the StarTracks program. Those currently enrolled in StarTracks will still be able to complete their program. During 2016, the new initiative will begin to roll out. While StarTracks has been well-rated and utilized by the scholars who have completed it, the purpose of the change is primarily to keep evolving our approaches to leadership development and to make the content fit the various learning styles of the participants.



Why an NPI?

The National Provider Identifier (NPI) is a unique 10-digit number that individually identifies all health care providers. Prior to 2004, the primary identifier for health care providers was either a state license number or a unique physician identification number (UPIN). Because different health care providers used various types of identifiers, Medicare required NPIs for all health care providers. All HIPPA compliant health care providers, including athletic trainers, are required to use the NPI as their identifier in all EMR systems when transmitting health information.

The athletic training profession is positioned to be a leader in health care reform, since our team based approach to health care is the model on which the future is based. As the health care industry moves to adopt prevention as a key component of patient care, athletic trainers must be at the forefront. Missing this opportunity would be extremely detrimental to the future of our profession. As health care providers, athletic trainers should have an NPI, regardless of setting.
